## **Discussion Questions:** Pick a few questions below to guide your time.

Starting Sharing: Choose a question or two to create openness.

- As you reflect on Daniel's story, where do you relate most and why?
- Why is it dangerous to live with the assumption that obedience begets a life of ease?
- How have you been successful in relating to people whose convictions differ from yours?

Start Thinking: Choose a question or two to think critically about the subject.

- What makes it difficult to believe God is in control when circumstances don't go our way?
- Why can conviction, separated from love, become more damaging than helpful?
- Read Philippians 2:6-11. Why does our approach trump our beliefs to the watching world? How is the church doing at modeling the way of Jesus?

## Make it Personal: Choose a question or two to help you identify your best next step.

- How would acknowledging God is not caught off guard by current events, but instead is orchestrating them for good, and for his purposes change your outlook?
- In what relationship do you need to seek relating over being right?

**Next Steps:** Everybody has a next step. Check out some ideas below to help you grow by doing.

- **Trust** Read and memorize Proverbs 19:21, "Many are the plans in a person's heart, but it is the Lord's purpose that prevails."
- **Acknowledge** When you feel the world or your world is out of control, take a moment and acknowledge that God is in control.

Prayer: Invite God to do what only He can do!
